### **INTRODUCTION:**

Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam is an ancient kotes in Indian scriptures, especially the Maha Upanishad. It promotes the idea of everyone being like one big global family, highlighting how we are all connected. Translated as "the world is one family," it emphasizes that we are part of one worldwide community. The concept of Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam (the world is one family), Sabka Saath, Sabka Vikas, Sabka Vishwas is related to it. Due to the increase in infection during the Corona epidemic, the demand for ordinary fever medicines in China had increased significantly. Not only this, India sent medicines to 150 countries during the Corona epidemic. Today, if there is any country in the world which is providing affordable medicines, it is India. Also, India helped in evacuation of stranded foreign nationals from about 123 countries from various parts of the country during the Corona pandemic.India has many important challenges of its own, but in our philosophy of life there is a desire for prosperity, security and progress for all so that the whole world can become glorious.

India does not support unilateral sanctions / military action. India does not support the idea of imposition of sanctions / military action against any country by any other country or group of countries, unless these sanctions / military actions have been approved by the United Nations. the United Nations Peacekeeping Force. India has contributed nearly 195,000 troops, the largest number by any country, participated in more than 49 missions and 168 Indian peacekeepers have made the supreme sacrifice while serving in UN missions. India has also provided and continues to provide eminent Force Commanders for UN missions. India does not believe in interfering in the internal affairs of other countries. India advocates a policy of constructive engagement rather than aggression. Global consensus on issues of global dimension - India advocates a global debate and global consensus on issues of global dimension such as global trade, order, climate change, terrorism, intellectual property rights, global governance.

India contacted almost all the countries of the world across similar time zones. This diplomatic outreach to all countries, big and small, underlined the Government's commitment to build relationships with countries large and small, in the spirit of "Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam" i. e. "the world is one family." China-During the visit of Chinese President Xi Jinping to India in September 2014, India extended a hand of friendship and sent a clear message that the two countries have to work together so that the 21st century becomes the century of Asia. Pakistan -In 2014, India's relations with Pakistan were not good. In accordance with its neighbourhood first policy, India made considerable efforts to normalise its strained relations with Pakistan. By early 2016, it was amply clear that the Pakistani deep state (Army and ISI) was not interested in resuming talks and continued to promote and support cross- border terrorism to the detriment of India.

South East Asia- ASEAN and East Asia In the context of India's extended neighbourhood, the 10 ASEAN countries in Southeast Asia are of immense importance. India's exposure to Asiatic tigers first began in the early 1990s. Overall, the relationship with the US has been gaining momentum in the last few years, apart from some recent hiccups in the bilateral relationship. The US has accorded India the status of a defence partner, which puts it on par with America's NATO allies. The Soviet Union and its successor state, the Russian Federation, have been described by India as trusted and tested friends. For a long time, Russia was the major source of defence procurement for India, for new, modern defence equipment and spares of equipment purchased earlier, we are still quite dependent on Russia. In Asia, Bhutan is the largest recipient

of development assistance from India. In October 2017, India committed US

\$600 million in grant assistance, including the India-Africa Development Fund (US \$100 million) and the India-Africa Health Fund (US \$10 million). Vietnam is another beneficiary of India's development assistance in the form of a USD 500 million Line of Credit. India has set aside a corpus of Rs 500 crore for manufacturing facilities in CMLV countries (Cambodia, Myanmar, Laos, Vietnam).
